
Sparklers @ Home week 4


1. First let's colour in our colour sheet to go with our story. A large copy will be available at the end of the pack.



2. Now it's time for our craft activity, we are going to be drawing round our feet and for this you will need help from your mummy and daddy.

For this craft activity you will need:

- A4 or A5 coloured card depending on what you have at home.
- Coloured pens and pencils
- A pencil to draw round your feet.
- Stickers, glitter or anything else you want to use to decorate your feet.
- 3. Take off your shoes and stand on the card which should be placed on a hard surface. Then stand as still as you can whilst your mummy or daddy draw round your feet with the pencil.
- 4. You can then colour in and decorate your feet with anything you like.

6. Next let's read our story, this is taken from Luke 24: 13-35.

The Walk to Emmaus
