

Sunday Services and Private Prayer

Sunday services continue inside the Church with appropriate measures to counter the spread of Covid. Until we have received an update to the Church of England guidelines, we advise pre-booking for any service: contact details: Paul and Alison Cannard (01473) 737707 or lantern.bredfield@gmail.com

We have also opened up the Church daily for private prayer. We request that four actions are taken if you wish to enter the church at a time other than for a planned church service.

- 1) Please do not come into the church if you have recently tested positive for COVID or display the symptoms of COVID.
- 2) Please use the hand sanitiser on the bench in the porch even better use your own before touching the outside porch door handle.
- 3) Please wear a mask whilst you are walking or standing in the church preferably at all times or at least until you are sat or knelt in a pew.
- 4) Leave the main door and porch door open whilst you are in church to aid ventilation. When you leave then both inner and outer doors can be shut again behind you as per normal.

These simple measures will aid the minimisation and spread of the COVID virus and help to keep your fellow parishioners safe.

NEWS FROM BREDFIELD

A Queen's Theatrical Jubilee



Due to the timing of the Queens Platinum Jubilee this year, I have decided to forego the May Window Display. The current window display features some thoughtful celebratory gifts: a Royal Canadian Mountie Horse (as the Queen adores horses), a jigsaw puzzle box with 70 on it (again the Queen loves jigsaw puzzles) and I have given her a Canine Partners Physical Assistance Dog, which is a charity that the Royals support and with her mobility issues would also be helpful to her Majesty.

Admittedly this article should reflect the Platinum Jubilee, but I would rather like to take you back to 1977 the year of the Queens Silver Jubilee and a year of drama for two reasons in my family:

We celebrated the actual Jubilee weekend at Sandringham with the Suffolk Caravan Club and decorated up our old Sprite caravan with various royal regalia for the rally competition of `Best of British Caravan'. Being a Club on

the Estate, we were allowed access to part of the Sandringham House collection, which was not usually open to the Public. Caravan outside decorations had to be taken down abruptly due to torrential rain – how quintessentially British!

The second event was the official formation of Bredfield Amateur Dramatic Society or B.A.D.S. I was very young but remember bits and pieces of note. For example, although officially B.A.D.S started in 1977, it was in fact the before that when the idea of a village drama group had really come to fruition. Sparked by performing a friend's written skit called `A Little Wooden Hut' at the annual Suffolk Caravan Club Talent Rally. The skit was set on a Pacific Island, so think grass skirts, sandals, pith helmets and songs... basically all very silly and chilly for a British climate!

Now I cannot quite remember the order of these, but the first play on the Old Bredfield Village Hall stage – I believe – was some kind of medley of short American plays that our co-founder family had provided. I definitely remember us doing some sort of Royal Themed Review during the Summer, because there was one skit in that which stood out... it was called `The Engs Kinglish' and was a delightful play on words in a cake shop where Spoonerisms abounded, well you probably gathered that from the title anyway?

B.A.D.S was set up as a Charity group to raise funds specifically for Bredfield, but mainly in the early days the money went towards the building of the New Bredfield Village Hall. To that end, the single sheet programmes doubled as tickets and it was decided to do a performance for three consecutive nights Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Thursdays being for Concessions or what was then called the Old Age Pensioners night. One such O.A.P Performance I recall had only eight people in the audience, one of which being dear Billy Richardson. After the performance, Billy stood up and thanked the acting cast on behalf of the entire audience for a wonderful show!

Of course as word spread, and our membership and audiences increased in numbers, it was not unheard of for the small hut of the old village hall to have people standing outside, leaning in through the windows to watch the Pantomimes.

The Pantomimes were the most popular, usually with original scripts, homebuilt ingenious multi-purpose scenery, live musicians & audience participation songs (usually with actions!), walk-on characters including once our pet Labrador! And always references to local villagers or places, plus tea

and biscuits were included in the ticket price. What an entertainment and bargain for the whole family back then!

Sadly, the drama group faded out and many of the original members have passed away too. But like the Queen, we remember and honour those before us and simply carry on!
